## The Maine Tree Club Will:

- ❖ Equip participants with the knowledge and skills to identify 50 trees of Maine.
- ❖ Create opportunities for people to learn more about trees in Maine through hands-on experiences (organized outings in the woods).
- ❖ Teach participants how to best care for trees on their property and in their community.
- ❖ Help people to better understand the importance of trees to Maine, their ecosystems and economy.

## Benefits

Participants will receive the following resources to make their learning experience enjoyable, and interesting.

- ❖ ***Notebooks with fact sheets*** - A 3-ring binder designed to hold monthly tree species fact sheets will help keep all Tree Club materials organized.
- ❖ ***Forest Trees of Maine*** - This pocket guide will make walks in the woods more educational and enjoyable.
- ❖ ***Hand Lens*** - Participants will receive a 10X hand lens, for discovering things up close.
- ❖ ***Other Aids*** - Numerous other tree related fact sheets and brochures will be distributed to participants.
- ❖ ***Hands on Learning*** - Participants will have the opportunity to attend at least 4 outings in different parts of the state, designed to increase their knowledge of Maine trees.
